MISSION:

The Bay Area Urban Debate League provides competitive debate education to Bay Area public schools so that all students can have the opportunity to reach their full potential as engaged learners, critical thinkers, and capable civic advocates.

Urban debate students:

- Have, on average, a 0.66 point higher GPA¹
- Are 3.1 times less likely to drop out of high school than nondebate students, with 95% graduating²
- Are 89% more likely to attend a four-year college and 80% more likely to graduate from college³

In alignment with BAUDL's value of civic participation, students hosted a Round Table addressing issues of Bay Area homelessness with Oakland Mayor Sheng Thao at Oakland City Hall. In celebration of MLK Day, students compiled and distributed hygiene care packages to local youth homeless shelters and group homes.

ALUMNI & COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP

BAUDL creates direct pathways for students to come into leadership, both at BAUDL and within the larger community. In 2022, BAUDL welcomed local alumna Mya Whitaker as BAUDL's Executive Director. She is the first debate student alumnus to lead a national urban debate league. In 2023, BAUDL welcomed Sekayi—a fiveyear BAUDL alumna, national competitor, and 2023 graduate from UC Berkeley—as Program Director.

Ashley Q. is a four-year all-star debater from Oakland Tech High School. A committed competitive debater, Ashley has been a big supporter of the next generation of debate students. They've provided mentorship to other students to ensure that the Oakland Tech team remains a powerhouse of debate. They will be attending Yale in the fall and are BAUDL's first Julia Burke Award Scholarship recipients, receiving \$2,000 for school support and \$2,000 to donate to a nonprofit of choice.

Who We Serve:

In 2023, BAUDL served:

300 middle and high school students \cdot 11 middle and high schools* \cdot 4 school districts

*All schools serve a majority students of color and low-income students (on average, 70% of students are on free and reduced lunch and 89% of students are students of color at participating schools). Schools include: Anna Yates Middle, Davidson Middle, Edna Brewer Middle, Emery High, Frick United Academy of Language, June Jordan School for Equity, KIPP King, McClymonds High, Oakland Tech High, Richmond High, Skyline High.

BAUDL is invested in all Bay Area youth being able to participate in debate teams, particularly Black and brown students who are traditionally underrepresented in the national debate community. BAUDL ensures equitable access to debate for students from all Bay Area schools despite variability in district funding. The composition of our debate league reflects the racial diversity of the Bay Area.

80% of BAUDL debate league students are students of color

- 27% Latinx, Hispanic and Mexican
- 22% Black / African American
- 20% White
- 18% Mixed Ethnicity
- 13% Asian
